For devotees of wind instruments and voice, we have both this season, with the 'explosive' Portugese soprano Filipa Portela, and the massed winds of the Orchestra of Scottish Opera.

Colin Scobie makes a welcome return visit to his native Peebles, having previously appeared in 2015 as Leader of the Maxwell Quartet and the following year for a recital with pianist Simon Lane (and that's not counting his childhood appearances in Peebles orchestra!). This time, he is with Welsh pianist Jâms Coleman, who has worked with many major names including tenor James Gilchrist and cellist Laura van der Heijden, both previous visitors to Peebles.

Their recital programme is a fascinating mix of well-loved masterpieces and less well known works. Ravel's second sonata is a remarkable, jazz-infused work, most obviously in its 'Blues' central movement. The last of Beethoven's three early sonatas is altogether more weighty than its predecessors and displays the grandeur and virtuosity that are hallmarks of his later works. The two contrasting sets of two pieces continue, in the case of the Copland, the 'Blues' theme, and in the case of the Boulanger, show what an immense talent the world lost when she died aged just 24. The superb Franck sonata brings the concert to a thrilling close.

Singaporean pianist Jia Ning Ng has recently graduated from the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland where, in addition to gaining B.Mus., M.Mus. and Artist Diploma, she won many prestigious awards. In April 2022, she made her debut with the RSNO, for which she was awarded First Prize in the RCS Concerto Competition. Jia Ning is also an active chamber musician, being particularly drawn to Lieder, and has also collaborated with the Resol String Quartet (who make a welcome return visit to Peebles in January 2024).

With a particular affinity for Schubert, it is natural that Jia Ning should choose, as the climax of her recital, his final instrumental work, the great Sonata in B flat, D.960, described by the *New Yorker* as 'a work of vast dimensions and vertiginous depths'.

Jia Ning opens her recital with Beethoven's dramatic 'Tempest' Sonata, which is followed by a collection of miniatures brought together by Schumann as his 'Bunte Blätter' (literally 'coloured leaves') which ranges from joyful to heartbreaking, jaunty to stormy.

Tim Kliphuis Trio

Tim Kliphuis (violin) Nigel Clark (guitar), Roy Percy (double bass)

'Brandenburg's Four Seasons'

Classically trained Dutch violinist Tim Kliphuis has been hailed as a contemporary improvising Paganini and is widely regarded as the heir to his mentor, Stéphane Grappelli. In his trio, Tim is joined by two brilliant Scottish musicians, both supremely talented jazz musicians in their own right. Nigel Clark is one of Europe's top acoustic guitarists, whilst Roy Percy is one of Britain's most in-demand double bass players, whose speciality is the rarely-heard 'slap bass' technique.

In this semi-improvised programme, the trio will perform movements from their most recent works: 'Reflecting the Seasons' and 'Brandenburg'. These interpretations of music by Vivaldi and Bach create a profoundly musical blend of classical, gypsy jazz and folk music, all delivered with a ready humour and great finesse, whilst remaining respectful to the originals.

There will also be some trusted swing tunes, blurring the lines between musical forms, and maybe a preview movement of the Trio's to-be-premiered 'Pictures at an Exhibition'.

'A Mediterranean Evening'

Songs and piano music by **Delibes, Debussy, Ravel, de Falla, Toldrà, Montsalvatge** and others

Since gaining her degree and Master's at the RCS, under the tutelage of Helen Lawson, Portuguese soprano Filipa Portela has enjoyed a busy career in concerts, recitals and opera. She has appeared in, as well as directed, her own opera productions to great acclaim, including Poulenc's 'La Voix Humaine' in the Edinburgh Fringe.

Edinburgh-born Gregor Forbes is a pianist and composer who studied at Cambridge University and the RCS. He has particular interests in avant-garde jazz and contemporary classical music (he is also Director of the Glasgow Experimental Music Series). Both he and Filipa are now resident in Leipzig.

In this concert, originally planned as part of the ill-fated 2020/21 season, Filipa and Gregor drive out the chill of a Scottish winter with a programme of warm and evocative Mediterranean-influenced music. We'll hear songs by Maurice Ravel, Manuel de Falla and Xavier Montsalvatge as well as a little-heard song cycle by Barcelonian composer Eduardo Toldrá. There will also be solo piano pieces by Ravel and Debussy.

Such was the impression made by the Resol Quartet on their first visit to Peebles (playing the reconstructed 'Eine Kleine Nachtmusik' in September 2022) that there were demands for an early return with a full recital programme. Happily, the wait has not been a long one and these outstanding young musicians are back with a programme of three works from three centuries.

From the late 19th century, we have one of Puccini's rare departures from the world of opera; his short, darkhued elegy 'Crisantemi' (Chrysanthemums). From 100 years earlier, we then hear Mozart's 'Dissonance' Quartet, with the tense, disorientating, and for its time radical, slow opening from which it takes its nickname.

Finally, from the mid-20th century, comes a work that Shostakovich considered one of his finest, taking us from impish humour through all manner of unease, trauma and heart-rending grief to end in 'a mysterious transformation into eternal light and conciliation'.

Ben Goldscheider shot to prominence when he won the Brass Category at the BBC Young Musician Competition in 2016. Since then, he has been in great demand internationally and has performed in major venues and with major orchestras across Europe.

As a chamber musician, Ben has worked with many famous artists, and his visit to Peebles is with an all-star trio, with New Zealand born violinist Benjamin Baker and Welsh born pianist and composer Huw Watkins.

The trio's programme includes a work written by Huw Watkins in 2008 for the Nash Ensemble, a single movement piece that alternates driving rhythmic passages with slower, contemplative music. This recent work is framed by two mainstays of the chamber music repertoire for horn. Mozart's Quintet, heard in an arrangement for trio, has been described as 'a horn concerto scored for chamber ensemble'. In the only chamber work he wrote for horn, Brahms shows the instrument's full emotional range, by turns majestic, graceful, sombre and thrilling.

The Patron's Concerts have been highlights of recent seasons, introducing our audience to some outstandingly talented young musicians, hand-picked for us by Gina McCormack. This year, Gina delights us by taking to the stage herself, along with her regular duo partner, Nigel Clayton, to bring our season to a memorable close.

Gina has chosen a Nordic-themed programme for us, bringing together familiar and not-so-familiar composers from Norway, Sweden and Finland. At its heart are sonatas by Norway's best-known composer, Edvard Grieg, and his lesser-known Swedish contemporary, Emil Sjögren.

These substantial works are accompanied by a fascinating mix of shorter pieces from Sweden (a 'Sentimental Romance' by Wilhelm Stenhammar), Norway (a Romance by Christian Sinding, often seen as the heir to Grieg) and Finland (a Humoresque and three of the 'Six Pieces for Violin and Piano' by Jean Sibelius).
